"The Successful Student" [WRITTEN ABOUT MARY SELDEN]

The successful student is dedicated.

My sister Mary—who I refer to as “M”— is in her dorm room when I arrive on campus from work around 5:30 on Sunday. She’s cross-legged on the floor, facing her bed and the 3x4 foot dry-erase board leaning against it. She’s surrounded by many-colored pens and dry-erase markers, with the fingers of one hand holding a page in her Theory of Probability textbook and a bright green dry-erase marker uncapped in her other hand. She’s glancing back and forth from the board to her book, and doesn’t acknowledge me. Her brow is furrowed and, as she looks back to the book once again, she presses the knuckles of her marker-holding hand tight against her lips. I’m not sure she notices me, even as I reach down next to the dry erase board to get the vacuum we share from under her bed. But she does.

“Oi, Chica,” is her tired greeting before launching into a litany about the confusion she’s having with the material. She starts explaining to me the problem she’s been working through on the board, breaking down the steps as she understands them. I know from past experience that talking the problem out with me would help M understand it, so instead of sneaking out to clean my room before starting my homework, I stay and pay attention. As she explains the difference between permutations and combinations, she refers to her notes on the board, gets confused, and checks the definitions in the book. When she leans down, I notice her hair is done up differently. Usually it’s in a tight bun at the base of her neck with each hair carefully rolled inside. Today it was loose and sloppy, with the frayed ends sticking out of the bun randomly.

After a few more fact checks and a quick discussion, M seems to understand the material better. But she’s not relieved: she is an hour behind her schedule for today because of her difficulties with the homework and she can’t take the time to finish it because she has to meet her group for her Research Methods class to continue working on the seven-page research proposal they need to have done by Tuesday. Unfortunately, she’ll have to find some time tonight to finish because the homework is due Wednesday, on the same day as the two exams she still hasn’t studied for.

Every night this weekend, M had gone to bed at four in the morning and had woken up at ten; she had spent every day barricaded in her dorm room. Her “Plan”—her schedule for the weekend to try to catch up on her homework before the next school week—is detailed and thorough, accounting for every minute. In the Plan, she allotted half an hour at noon and 6 p.m. for meals.

“I had to cut them down to 20 minutes because I wasn’t getting enough done,” she told me. Yet even as she packed up her stuff to leave for dinner, she grabbed an article she needed to read for another class.

The successful student is organized.

I once asked her how she manages to stay organized. She shrugged like keeping track of her commitments and classes was no big deal and said, “I keep a planner, often layered with sticky notes when I can’t fit any more writing or when it gets to be too much to decipher, and a small dry-erase board in my room on my desk to keep track of major assignments in each of my classes.” She showed me her planner for school. Its pages bleed colors; there is no white space—no any space—left.

“I’ve had random people gasp when I open my planner, let alone when I actually describe what’s happening. They seem dumbfounded and a little afraid or worried. I find their reactions very amusing, in a sad sort of way. I honestly don’t think many people can imagine [what I’m going through]...but then again, I know many people who seem extremely busy too. I wonder about them, and I want to ask, ‘Do you have to hole up in your room literally all weekend too?’”

M, even though our mother’s house is only an hours-drive away from the college, almost never goes home on the weekends because she ends up oversleeping and getting distracted by family matters (“Good,” I told her when she complained that she didn’t hear her alarm one Saturday when she was home. “You need to sleep. Six or less hours around constant studying is a tough schedule to maintain for three solid weeks.”). Because Mom works so often, she often needs M to pick up our little sister Dolly from her friend’s house while she’s at work, or to run the garage sale all weekend

because Mom can't afford to take off work to do it, or to clean up the kitchen because no one got to it this week. It's more productive to just come home when the clean laundry runs out so the family chores don't get pushed on top of the rest of her responsibilities.

The successful student is hard-working.

My sister has a 4.0 grade point average, but don't ever call her "smart" to her face. Nothing gets her riled up more than people who thoughtlessly—and, in her mind, wrongly—attribute her success and good grades to something as passive as intelligence. She takes dozens of pages of notes for each class, usually including notes from class and from the book. If the professor uses PowerPoint slides, she'll beef them up with handwritten notes from the readings and the textbook. (None of which are required in her classes—she feels she needs the repetition of writing to learn the material.) But the studying doesn't stop at note-taking. When she has a test, she reads through the notes multiple times, highlighting the key words and ideas and mentally quizzing herself. With material that needs to be memorized, she'll write out the lists on her dry-erase board until she has them committed to memory. It's a time-consuming way to study, but it guarantees that she learns the material well.

The only real rivals for her time besides homework and studying are work and club activities. M has approximately four jobs, each with a varying degree of hourly commitment attached: she has eight hours a week of work-study in the on-campus Art Gallery, she's a tutor for the college ("I work about one to three hours a week if I can fit it," she told me) and she tutors two girls outside of school on Sundays for about an hour—more if you include travel time. She also works for Patricia Gray in Academic Services for three to six hours a week, mostly training new tutors. She's hoping that our aunt—who works as a bookkeeper and secretary to St. Rita's church in Brooklyn, Michigan, and at St. Vincent de Paul's thrift shop in Jackson, Michigan—might be able to give her some weekend work as well. I told her to wait for next semester when her life calms down a little bit. While she didn't quite agree with me, I believe she is going to postpone the job search. It's not like there's any room in her Plan for more work. I've seen the Plan—there's no room for *anything*. And yet there's always more to do, including various art and writing club meetings and activities, the majority of which she attends regularly (more regularly than many of the other members).

The successful student is motivated.

Even though M's in her third year of college, she has almost enough credit hours accumulated to be considered a senior. Currently, she's taking three 300-level classes and one writing-intensive class, as well as a seminar class at Siena Heights University to prepare for graduate school as part of the Ronald E. McNair Post-Baccalaureate Scholarship Program. By the end of this semester—if she survives—she will be well into the "senior" range of credit hours. Her hope is that next year, when she'll be applying to grad schools, she can take it easy on her classes and focus on preparing and filling out paperwork.

M epitomizes the concept of delayed gratification. For her, there are not only immediate and future goals, but goals for every stage in between. Keeping up in her classes is an immediate goal, as are living through this semester and not falling behind in her McNair responsibilities. Getting accepted into graduate school is the next step, one that will involve both McNair and copious amounts of prep work and research. Graduate school, in turn, will lead her to what she hopes will be a successful life in research psychology, her chosen career.

That's her hope, anyway, and the motivation behind her hard work. No one's pushing at her to do well and to do more—she realized that she'd need to on her own. She told me she works so hard because she realizes at what level she needs to be to succeed in grad school. "Grad school is super-competitive so I need to become just *that much* better. I need to get ready. Once there, it will be just as hard, or more so, than what I'm doing now," she said.

"Besides," she said with a smirk, "It takes too much effort *not* to do well." But the sacrifices she makes—giving up sleeping, hours of working, the opportunity to take "fun" classes, and hanging out with friends and family—is hard. "Sometimes I feel like I am accomplishing so much, but mostly I feel like I'm being dragged along, living week by week (sometimes day by day) and missing out on life and opportunities—simple pleasures—because 'I don't have time.'" And while she's staying afloat so

far, she can't rid herself of this feeling of impending doom, this expectation that any day or week soon everything will fall apart and comes crashing down around her ears.

"It's funny...when I heard about those two *über*-tests on Wednesday when I was already behind on the research paper I needed to write for Tuesday's peer review in class, I just laughed (a little hysterically, but I laughed). I couldn't help it. But when I unintentionally drop my book bag or pen or keys, or my sweatshirt falls off the chair onto the ground, I just want to give up."

The successful student is stressed out.

M's life is a careful balance of classes, work, homework, clubs, and family. To help herself stay focused, she's written out a priorities list. The top of the list and most important is McNair, a program that helps undergraduates get experience doing their own research like they would in graduate school. Right now this includes a seminar class one a week and reading many, many articles on the subject she's going to independently research.

Unfortunately, despite her priorities list, the immediacy of her other classwork has been supplanting her research. "Ideally, I would like at least three hours for each subject a night to read things, write notes, and do homework. Maybe I wouldn't need so much if I could get a handle on things, but since life isn't ideal, I'm constantly behind. I push off what needn't be handled immediately until it *does* need to be handled immediately. I try to work on big projects in between, but it always pushes something else out. There are literally not enough hours in the day to finish what I need to finish."

This sounds a lot like what my parents have always said—there's always work to be done on the house, always bills that are becoming overdue, but the daily living expenses and daily workload are already too much to handle. It seems like whenever my family does finally start to pull ahead and save some money, something invariably happens. The drier dies, or the car, or the lawn mower, or the township said to clean up the yard and now Mom needs to take a few days off to organize the house, or something. There's always something important being pushed off to more pressing matters, always work and more work that never seems to end.

"I spend the entire weekend in my room doing homework and I never catch up—or, God forbid—get ahead. Ever. Basically, if I am not doing something productive every free minute, I will suffer for it later. Always," M told me at lunch one afternoon. Her face was drawn and paler than even usual; her eyes were underlined with dark bruises from the lack of sleep. Seeing her so tired and frustrated, the parallels between her situation and my parents' stressful lives are increasingly evident. The only difference is the hoped-for outcome of the hard work: for Mom, it's keeping the house, for M, it's a PhD and a career. All this stress for a dream deferred; a shadowy hope for success in the future.

But while "Dr. Selden" is a title no one else in our immediate or extended family has yet to receive, the prestige is a minor factor for M; success in life for her means having the life she wants, a life where she doesn't have to work fifty or sixty hours a week to keep up on the house payment, groceries, phones, tuition for three college students, and dozens of other expenses; where she won't wear her body out with exhausting labor. Success in college, grad school, a career—all of it will lead to a life of contentment. M always says that the ultimate goal is to be content: to be able to live without having to work as hard as our parents do every day.

I hope she reaches it.

[Writer's note: This piece was written in the Fall of 2010. M has since been able to recover from her exhaustion with some well-deserved rest and the satisfaction of knowing her hard work paid off. She was able to ace all of her classes, keep her 4.0 GPA, and is well on her way to running her independent research project as part of McNair. She was even, this semester, able to pick up work with our Aunt Jeannie on the weekend, just like she hoped. (March 2011)]
